

In the Fall of 2022, Pastor Phil provided a six week program entitled, "Dreams: God's For-gotten Language." - *Special Note:* In order to make all the photos uniform in size, we may have to crop some of the edges.

If you don't have the capability of submitting a digital image, you have at least two other options:

- have a friend or family member snap a photo of you and ask them to submit that for you,
- ask Roxy Webster to take your picture the next time you're at church, or
- bring a printed photo to church sometime and we can scan it.

CWS Emergency Cleanup Buckets

Thanks to everyone who helped assemble cleanup buckets on Sun. Dec. 8th. 20+ volunteers packed up 10 emergency buckets and shipped them to the Church World Service distribution center in Maryland.

As of Oct. 18, CWS has distributed 5,824 Emergency Cleanup Buckets, 10,310 Hygiene Kits, 7,280 Blankets, 1,800 Menstrual Hygiene Kits, 650 School Kits and 72 Welcome Backpacks to partners in Florida and North Carolina (a value of more than \$697,000). CWS will also be involved in long-term recovery to help meet the needs of those impacted in the months and years to come.


